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### Awareness of Child Abuse and Neglect – Core:



This course is suitable for everyone who work directly with children and young people, including frontline professionals. This course covers a variety of child protection and safeguarding children issues and is suitable for anyone who regularly comes into contact with children or who may be asked to contribute to the assessment of children in need.

The course aims to inform about the various types of abuse and neglect that can happen to a child and then explain what you must do if you suspect a child is being abused or neglected.

This course allows you to choose the legislation which applies to your country, should it be England, Wales, Scotland or Northern Ireland.

*A section of this course looks into multi-agency cooperation focusing specifically at Police, Social Services, Social Housing, Healthcare, Education (Early Years, Primary, Secondary, Further or Higher), Prisons, Secure Units, Probation, Youth Justice Youth Groups Community Groups & Voluntary groups.*

### Safeguarding Children in Education:



This module contributes towards protecting children as well as supporting them and their families when in need, by providing all staff, working with children in education settings, with consistent and reliable safeguarding information, based on current local and national guidance.

### Safeguarding Children and Young People from Abuse by Sexual Exploitation:



Increases awareness of the main issues in the sexual exploitation of children and young people and raises awareness of the legislation and guidance that applies to vulnerable groups and how these policies can be applied in practice. Aimed at anyone who comes into contact with children and young people during the course of their work.

### Awareness of Domestic Violence and Abuse:



This **Awareness of Domestic Violence and Abuse course** has been created with victims in mind and will inform learners about domestic violence and abuse, and how to support those experiencing it.

Each year around 2.1 million people (men and women) in England and Wales suffer some form of domestic abuse. On average high risk victims live with domestic violence abuse for 2.6 years before seeking help and

23% of those victims attend A&E as a result of their injuries in the year before they get help.

### Trafficking, Exploitation and Modern Slavery:



This course is about understanding, combating and helping people who are being trafficked, exploited or used in modern slavery. It examines different types of exploitation, how individuals become victim to abuse and what actions professionals should take to recognise victims and help them

### Understanding Pathways to Extremism and the Prevent Programme:



This course is aimed at all professionals who work in sectors where they come into contact with people who may be vulnerable to radicalisation, whether they are adults, children or young people.

The aim of the course is to give you an awareness of the radicalisation process so you can feel confident about being proactive in taking a multi-agency approach to early intervention and support.

### Self-harm and Suicidal Thought in Children and Young People:




This course aims to educate learners about the warning signs, risk factors and actions to take should they suspect a child or young people is self-harming or having suicidal thoughts.

### An Introduction to FGM, Forced Marriage, Spirit Possession and Honour Based Violence:



Provides an understanding of Female Genital Mutilation, Honour Based Violence, Spirit Possession and Forced Marriage. These are the four main types of abuse that stem from culture related traditions and this course increases awareness of specific cultural and religious needs whilst providing the knowledge practitioners need to be confident when conversing with those from a different cultural background around the subjects.

### Hidden Harm:



When it comes to drug and alcohol misuse in adults focus is often on the parent. This course aims to emphasis the effects on children and young people, raises awareness and helps spot signs and identify appropriate windows to help break the cycle and safeguarding the child.

### eSafety Guidance for Practitioners:



Technology is affecting younger age groups. Whereas earlier generations had to be content with dressing up as a cowboy or princess instead of using toy guns, boys and girls are armed with games consoles, mobile phones and the monster weapon that is the internet. Children don't only have access to technologies at home; ICT is embedded across the curriculum, so with such exposure children typically have a lot of confidence. However, their knowledge of the risks and dangers may not be high. As the internet is available in many places; anyone who works with children has a role to play in providing eSafety education as well as supporting parents in providing a safe home environment.
